Housekeeping

Just a quick reminder that every member should keep the following in mind: -

Safety is everyone's responsibility, if you see something or someone that is unsafe then tell them about it and if they continue to do it bring it to the attention of the committee, this is the only way that we can keep our flying field safe and enjoyable for everyone.

Always observe the guidelines for safe flying at the field and especially with regard to not flying over the road or in the safety zone, if you are having difficulty landing at the Lyth Valley site then just ask an instructor for some guidance on landing approaches.

Please remember that smoking near flammable liquids is prohibited, this includes when working on models that are fuelled either ready for flight or after flight.

All models whilst in the pits are to be tethered and pointing away from the pits whenever they have their engine running, this applies both to I/C and electric models.

Dogs are welcome at the site provided they are kept on a lead and under control at all times, under no circumstances are they to be taken into the field beyond the pits area, please remember that we have permission to fly from this site and not to exercise dogs on it.

There have been some recent comments regarding the use of inappropriate language at the field, whilst our hobby can occasionally be frustrating please remember that our proximity to Brigsteer Causeway does mean that every comment (or worse profanity) can be overheard by a member of the public. As I am sure everyone appreciates complaints from the public is something that we simply do not want

Finally over the past few months some items have been placed in the hut that do not appear to belong to the club, as the committee will soon be having a tidy out of the hut please ensure that any personal belongings are removed before the end of July, otherwise they could inadvertently find their way to the tip!
